All players are required to buy a reversible JAWS shirt. You can buy the shirts at Great American Sports. You also must have a pair of shin guards & soccer socks that cover your shin guards and a ball with your child's name and phone # written on the ball. HOME team wears RED and the VISITING team wears BLUE.

No jewelry can be worn by a player during a game. Ears should not be pierced prior to the season, as players will be required to remove them to play. Anything worn in the hair that could be considered dangerous is not allowed. JAWS does not allow metal cleats or cleats with a single spike in the toe area (football or baseball style).

Please keep our park clean by picking up trash left on the field.

FALL 2016 SOCCER Rules and Regulations



GENERAL GUIDELINES

• Only players rostered to the participating teams will be allowed to play in a league game. Coaches: If you or the opposing team does not have enough players present to participate, meet and divide the eligible players present into 2 evenly skilled teams and play the game. Rotate or swap players as needed to make an evenly skilled match.

• A player must not wear anything that is dangerous to themselves or another player. This includes jewelry of any kind, except for items that are clearly medical or religious in nature, such as medical alert bracelets or wedding bands. In all cases, the referee must not consider these items to be dangerous. Players are not allowed to have ANY kind of beads or metal hair pieces. They shall not be allowed to play unless they remove the pieces from their hair.

Concussions / Heading:

Players that are 10 years old & under - No Heading Allowed

Players 11-12 years old - Limited Heading Allowed In Practice ONLY

Players 13 years old & older - Heading Allowed in Practice and in Games

Violation of this rule is an indirect free kick. Persistent violation can result in a yellow card and a second yellow card infraction would result in a red card. If a parent makes the decision for their child to play up, resulting in the child playing in 13 or up, the parent must be made aware of the fact that it is in direct conflict with the mandate that goes into effect 8/1/16 regarding heading. The primary concern of all organizations and leagues is to provide a safe as possible playing and practice environment. The parent in this case of wanting their child to play up would assume the potential risk relative to heading and concussions since they have been made aware that it is in conflict to the mandate effective 8/1/16. If a player is sent off by a referee for a possible concussion, the coach and parent assume responsibility if the player is sent back into the game. The referee can send the player back off the field if symptoms of a concussion is evident.

• Spectators must sit or stand on one sideline while both teams' players and coaches are on the other sideline (the one with the team benches). No one may sit or stand behind the goal lines.

• Coaches are responsible for the conduct of their team, including players, assistant coaches and parents.

• Each coach is responsible for playing each player at least half the game.

• The JAWS board may suspend or expel from the league any parent, coach, player, or referee guilty of misconduct.

• Coaches may file protests on rules or eligibility decisions with the referee and turned in to JAWS no later than the Wednesday following the game. The JAWS board will issue a decision as soon as possible.

• If at all possible, COJ will facilitate the rescheduling of rain-outs or schedule conflicts with coaches assistance.

• Except for each team's goal keeper, all members of a team must wear shirts of the same color.

Starting in the spring of 2005, JAWS youth players will wear RED and ROYAL reversible JAWS approved soccer shirt available individually from Great American Sports HOME team wears RED and the VISITING team wears BLUE. Non-uniform clothing is allowable based on weather conditions, but the reversible shirt must be worn on the outside. Shirts should not be customized with names, numbers or other decorations so that the shirts may be worn season after season.

• All players must wear age & size appropriate shin guards worn under the socks.

• Referees have TOTAL decision making power regarding substitutions, time keeping, suspension of games, and infringements of the laws of the game including cautions or sendoffs. Unlimited substitutions may take place at any stoppage with the permission of the referee.

• JAWS does not allow metal cleats or cleats with a single spike in the toe area (football or baseball style).

• A player initiating a restart may not touch the ball a second time; indirect free kick results for the opposing team.

• Ball remains in play while any part of it is within, on, or over the touch (side) lines or goal (end) lines.

• Quick restarts on free kicks and throw-ins are an exciting and encouraged part of the game.

• Games may end in a tie; no overtime.

GAME DAY REMINDERS

• Spectators must sit or stand on one sideline while both teams' players and coaches will be on the other sideline (the one with the team benches).

• Have all your players at the game site 15 minutes before the scheduled game start time.

• Be sure all your players, coaches and spectators show good sportsmanship.

• Do not allow anyone to hang on the goals or nets. This can be dangerous.

• 10 & U - Each team to supply two club linesmen for each game. Please prepare before the game.

• 12& U & Older - Each team may need to supply one club linesman at each game. Prepare before the game.

• 10 & U & Older - After each game, assist the referee by collecting the game ball, the goal keeper shirt, and the linesman's flag. This helps to keep the games on schedule.

• At the start of each game and each half/quarter, players must start with tucked in shirt tails.

10 & UNDER BOYS & 10 & UNDER GIRLS All rules conform to the FIFA laws of the game except as follows:

1. There is 1 field of 6 v. 6 for each game. Field size is 140 x 90 ft. The center circle and penalty arc radii are 8 yds. Goals are 6.5 x 18.5 ft. Goal area is 6 yds. from the goal line and each goal post. Penalty area is 10 yds from the goal line and each goal post. The penalty mark is 8 yds from goal line. Penalty arc is 8 yards from the penalty mark.

2. The ball size is a #4.

3. 6 v. 6. Boys and girls' leagues are separate. Team rosters are a minimum of 6 and a maximum of 12.

4. Each team needs a minimum of 5 players per field to start a game. Each team must have a goal keeper.

5. Games consist of 2 halves of 25 minutes each, with 5 minutes at half-time. A coin toss determines which team takes the kickoff (per FIFA the coin toss loser takes kickoff). Teams switch ends at half.

6. Each team must be prepared to supply 1 club linesman.

7. Coaches may not be on the field.

8. **On the players and coaches side of the field, there can only be rostered players, 1 coach and 1 assistant coach. The coach and assistant coach have to be listed on the roster. Everyone else must sit on the opposite side designated for spectators and parents.**

9. **The coach, assistant coach and players will be confined to the specified area for their team. This designated area will be 3 feet from the touchline and starting from the substitution area at midfield extending 10 yards on your teams half of the field. The assistant coach will stay on the bench the whole game. The coach can get off the bench, but cannot leave the designated area. First time out of the box is a warning. The second time out of the box the other team gets a penalty kick.** 10. The referee or coach is to briefly explain all infractions to the offending player.

11. No heading the ball at this age.

12. Emphasize fun. Scores will be kept by the referee, only to monitor the 4-goal advantage rule.

13. If a team reaches a 4-goal advantage, the opposing team coach will select a player from the team that is ahead to move to their team. The teams will play 7 player (opposing team) v 6 players (4-goal advantage team). If the advantage team scores a 5-goal advantage, the opposing team will select another player from the team that is ahead to move to their team still playing 7 v 6. If the advantage drops, a player will return to their own team. If the advantage drops again the other player will return to their own team. Girls should wear a cotton shirt under their game shirt. This will be needed if the child is the players chosen to play on the opposing team. We will have a red and a blue vest in the field equipment bag. Remember that all players must play at least 50% of the game. The referee shall oversee the coaches pulling of players to see that it is fair.

14. There are no offside offenses, but the referee may warn for cherry picking.

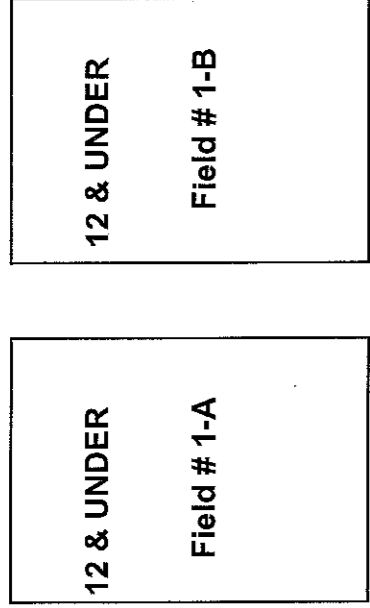
15. Fouls and misconduct conform to FIFA.

16. Opposing players must be at least 8 yards from the ball during free kicks, goal kicks, or corner kicks.

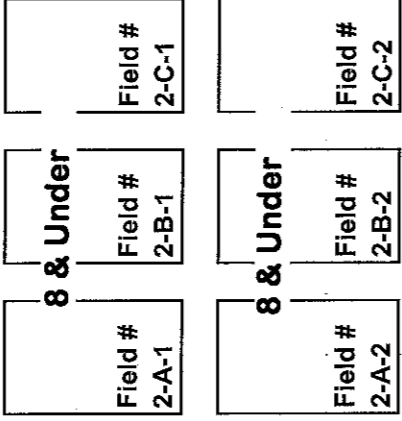
17. Throw-ins, Free kicks, Penalty kicks, Goal kicks & Corner kicks conform to FIFA
